<b>Year 1 and 2</b>	<b>Van Goetz (von gets)</b>	She investigates the use of nanoparticles to make clothes UV resistant/waterproof.
<b>Year 3 and 4</b>	<b>Edison</b>	He invented the electric light system, the phonograph, and a motion picture machine.
<b>Year 5 and 6</b>	<b>Bath</b>	She was <b>an ophthalmologist, or eye</b> doctor, and invented a new technique and device for cataract surgery.
