King Charles III Wildflower Seeds

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Ambassadors organised a gardening session last week. During this time, the children tidied up the Peace Garden and dug some areas which were then planted with our King Charles III Wildflower Seeds.

The flowers that grow will contribute to creating around 40 hectares of new wildflowers across England. The packets of seeds include native annual wildflower species; cornflower, corn poppy, corn

chamomile, corncockle, corn marigold and catchfly. The wildflowers should provide food for a wide range of insects including bees, butterflies and other pollinators in school grounds across England.

Parent Forum

It was great to spend time with the parents who joined us at the Parent Forum. We discussed the Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) curriculum, including the relationships and sex education elements. It was interesting to see how these start in the Early Years and build through to Year 6.

School Meal Prices

From September 2023, school meal prices are to increase to £3.56 for KS2 and £2.10 for nursery. For quite some time, the school has been absorbing the rising costs of school meals, but unfortunately this is no-longer viable as we manage an already stretched school budget.

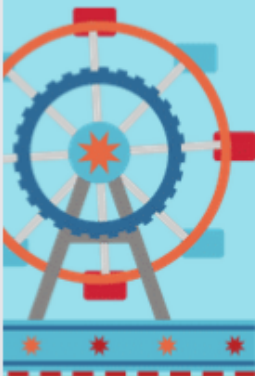
