# How to enter:

- 1. Each student can submit one piece of artwork and there is **no theme**.
- 2. Send your completed artwork into school.
- 3. Provide some information about the piece such as title, size, and a little text about the artwork and why you made it.
- 4. The artwork can be made using any material; it can be a painting, sculpture, photograph, installation, video, drawing, or a combination.
- 5. Remember, judges are looking for imagination, originality and skill.

6. Entries need to be returned to school by 20<sup>th</sup> March 2024. Entries submitted after this date will not be entered.
