Neurodiversity Celebration Week 2023

This week we (along with many other schools) have been taking part in Neurodiversity Celebration Week and we have been able to show you some of the things that we have been up to at our most recent Learning Together morning. When it comes to inclusion, neurodiversity refers to a world where neurological differences are recognised and respected. Depending on how our brains are wired we think, move, process information and communicate in different ways. Many people in our community use neurodiversity as an umbrella term used to describe alternative thinking styles such as Dyslexia,

DCD (Dyspraxia), Dyscalculia, Autism and ADHD. But regardless of labels, neurodiversity is about recognising those who think differently. Approximately 15-20% of population have a neurological difference.

In our classrooms, we have been challenging our thinking. We have been looking at various optical illusions, brain exercises and some classes set themselves drawing challenges.
