### Safeguarding

May is Skin Cancer Awareness month – an annual event to raise awareness of skin cancer, the most common form of cancer in the UK. According to Cancer Research UK, 1 in 34 UK males and 1 in 47 UK females will be diagnosed with melanoma during their lifetime and it's now one of the biggest killing cancers in the 15-34 age group.

#### Yet around 90% of cases are preventable!

Whilst some sun is good for us, over-exposure to UV is a serious health risk and the primary cause of the UK's most common and fastest rising cancer. UV is a known carcinogen, damage is cumulative and irreparable and burning as a child can dramatically increase a persons risk of developing the disease in later life. Children spend almost half their childhood at school, where they are outdoors regularly during peak UV hours (11am - 3pm), so it's important that children are safeguarded from UV damage and learn how to enjoy the sun safely to prevent skin cancer in later life.


To mark Skin Cancer Awareness month this year, the [Humber and North Yorkshire Cancer Alliance](#) is offering free bitesize skin cancer awareness sessions to teach people about the signs and symptoms of skin cancer, and to help people track symptoms and talk to their GP. **These 30-45 minute sessions are open to everyone and can be booked [here](#).**
