It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need. We recommend you start by reflecting on the impact of current provision and reviewing the previous spend.

Schools are required to publish details of how they spend this funding, including any under-spend from 2021/2022, as well as on the impact it has on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment. The funding should be spent by 31st July but the DfE has stated that there will be no clawback of any unspent money so this can be carried forward into 2023/24.

This evidences your ongoing self-evaluation of how you are using the funding to secure maximum, sustainable impact. 
