

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Play board games with family.

Do an activity you find challenging.

Teach children about your values and why they are important.

Language and Communication

Ask your child to tell you a story that you write down and retell it with small world.

Role play cafes and shops.

Use fabrics to create dressing up.

Play sound games.

Talk as much as you can modelling language with your child.

Show children how to ask questions and be curious.

Play with sand and water.

Physical Development

Make and play with playdough at home.

Pick up peas with fingers or tweezers and count how many you have.

Exercise every day for an hour inside and an hour outside.

Practise hopping, skipping and jumping.

Practise ball throwing and catching.

Cutting with scissors as much as you can.

Literacy

Storytelling with your child using props.

Reading stories.

Practise name writing.

Sing Nursery rhymes.

Practise handwriting letters with laminated worksheets for short bursts can use finger in sand.

Home Learning Challenges Reception Spring Term

Phonics

Play their favourite music, ask them to clap and dance to the music listening to the beat, when the music stop strike a pose and freeze.

Practise tricky words.

Play the game 'I went to the shop and I bought...' using a shopping bag and objects. Each item must be recalled in order.

Find things around the house starting with different letters.

Ask your child to find an object in the room i.e. Car. Can you find another object in the room that starts with the same sound i.e. Cup?
