

Out Of This World - Week Five

The theme for our learning in our last week of the Spring term is 'Easter'.



Personal, Social and Emotional <u>Development</u>

Talk about the Easter story and that it is a Christian tradition. Talk about how Jesus was selfless- what does that mean? How can we be selfless? How can we help others? Discuss new life- what does it mean? Discuss life cycle of humans.

Communication and Language

Small world Easter story/garden tuff tray encourage the use of new language e.g. tomb, resurrection, new life.

Expressive Arts and Design

Paper towel eggs - cut egg-shapes out and add felt pen designs. Use pipets to add water droplets to make the felt pen merge into a pattern.

- Use 3-D shapes for tasks
- 3-D shapes in the environment
- Identify more complex patterns
- Copy and continue patterns
- Patterns in the environment
