




Vocabulary

political party	A group of people with similar views to one another, who want to be <b>elected</b> to <b>represent</b> the people of a country. <b>Democracies</b> have political parties.	economic migrant	Someone who has <b>migrated</b> in order to improve their standard of living.
criminal justice system	The system that ensures that people who break <b>laws</b> have <b>consequences</b> but are treated fairly.	asylum seekers	People who have left their country to <b>seek</b> (look for) <b>asylum</b> (safety/protection) in another country.
Fair Trade	Paying a fair price for produce from poorer countries.		
migration (migrant/migrate(d))	Movement from one country to another (permanently) is migration. People who move are migrants. They have migrated.	refugee	People who have been granted <b>asylum</b> (the government has agreed to offer them safety and protection in the country they have <b>immigrated</b> to).
emigration (emigrant/emigrate(d))	Leaving a country is called <b>emigration</b> . When someone leaves their country, they have <b>emigrated</b> . We call them an <b>emigrant</b> .	travellers	A member of a <b>community</b> that traditionally has an itinerant life (moves around from one place to another in a moveable home, such as a caravan.)
immigration (immigrant/immigrate(d))	Arriving to another country is called <b>immigration</b> . When someone arrives in another country, they have <b>immigrated</b> . We call them an <b>immigrant</b> .	poverty	The state of being extremely poor and not being able to afford what you need.

**The parts of our criminal justice system**

<p><b>Law Enforcement</b></p>  <p>Police patrol communities to help prevent crimes, to investigate them when they do happen, and to arrest people suspected of committing crimes.</p>	<p><b>Courts System</b></p>  <p>The court system consists of attorneys (solicitors/lawyers), judges and juries. The guilt or innocence of a suspect is determined in court.</p>	<p><b>Corrections System</b></p>  <p>Police patrol communities to help prevent crimes, to investigate them when they do happen, and to arrest people suspected of committing crimes.</p>
